
# EAST BAY REGIONAL PARK DISTRICT 2023 CALENDAR

#### Claremont Canyon Regional Preserve, Oakland

#### Martin Luther King Jr. Regional Shoreline, Oakland

This 748-acre shoreline park preserves the remainder of a once-extensive marshland at San Leandro Bay, featuring an important stopover for migrating birds on the Pacific Flyway. Take in the views on a 3.5-mile round-trip hike on the Marsh Trail featured in the 2021 Trails Challenge guidebook.

The trails at Point Pinole lead through breezy meadows with wildflowers in season, aromatic eucalyptus woods, or along bluffs and beaches on San Pablo Bay. Venture through the entire park and enjoy restored marshlands on a moderate 5.9-mile hike on the 2023 Trails Challenge.
