How Did this Project Originate?

- Measure WW \$1.4 Mil
- Update pool and facilities

Why this Pool Facility so Important?

- Focus on recreational swim
- Day Camps, Lessons, Clubs, Service
 Orgs (Almost always at Capacity due to current shallow end configuration note empty deep end in photo)
- District Lifeguard and Safety Trainings

What's the Project Schedule?

- 95% Construction Documents
- Bid ready by February 2021
- Construction Sept 2021





What Do We Know Today?

- Built in 1954
 - OLD
 - But- it's existing facility so entitled land use
 - Not connected to municipal utilities
- Total scope and scale of the renovation needs were not initially known until project permitting requirements were identified
- Cost is in-line with recently built municipal pool and facility renovations in the region



- Pool operation is becoming more compromised as the pool ages
- Construction costs escalate 5% each year on average



Previous Board Actions

- August 2019 Full Board- Appropriated \$1,350,000 Measure WW funds for the Renovate Pool Project at Roberts Regional Recreation Area.
- August 2019 Full Board- Awarded a contract in the amount of \$400,000 to RPR Architects of Oakland, California for design, construction documents preparation, permitting, bidding and construction administration support for the Renovate Pool Project
- March 2020 Exec Committee- Recommended approval of the proposed schematic design and project program.
- September 2020 Full Board Appropriated \$1,292,710 funds from State Parks, Per Capita Grant
- December 3, 2020 Exec Committee- Project Update



Schematic Design Approved by Board Executive Committee March 2020





Construction Total: \$8.3 Mil

Existing Pool Area 2,712 sf Renovated Pool Area 5,617 sf

- 1. \$4.8 M Pool/Site
 - Includes demo of entire facility, utilities, new pool, pool deck, retaining walls, planting, irrigation, entry kiosk, fences/gates, septic, and ADA parking.
- 2. \$2.3 M Pool House
 - Includes public changing rooms and restroom the lifeguard office/changing/restroom/kitchenette, and park operations office and money counting room
- 3. \$1.2 M Pump House
 - Includes all mechanical (pump & surge)
 equipment & chemical rooms for pool and
 storage space for operations/lifeguard activities
 & training

TODAY'S RECOMMENDATION

- Authorize an amendment with Griffin Structures, Incorporated (Griffin) of Santa Clara,
 California in the amount of \$476,400 for a total contract amount of \$520,000 for construction management services.
- Authorize an amendment with RPR Architects (RPR) of Oakland, California in the amount of \$152,267 for a total contract amount of \$612,042 for design and engineering services.
- Authorize direct payments for permits related to construction in an amount not-to-exceed \$150,000.

MOVING FORWARD

- Proceed with District funding and continue to pursue outside funding
- Spring 2021 Award Construction Contract
- Spring/Summer 2022 Complete Construction
